Coaching day

Polishing up your bowling skills



What a valuable way to spend a Sunday morning! A group of 12 Hatfield Bowlers, a mix of seasoned and novice players, came together on Sunday 20th

June, We were joined by four expert county coaches arranged by Ian. Thank you Ian.

Everyone came away with something and many bowling myths were discarded along the way.

Three themes were explored:

Reading the head;

Finding your line and weight;

Consistency in delivery.

For those who are the strategists, lively debate over the best next shot as the head was built up, was very interesting. The coach experimented with a variety of patterns we could all recognise and demonstrated the likely outcome of different strategies. We all became much more aware of all the different factors to weigh up and the importance of drawing on each bowlers' strengths. A picture was painted of how to get the team to play as a whole.

Then, we moved on to examine the relationship between line and length. We all saw progress following the tips on how to prepare yourself before stepping up to the mat and the impact of increasing the speed of your arm action. I had always been told "don't take our arm so far back" but the key is the pace of your arm. Also, did you know that when waiting you shouldn't hold the bowl in your bowling hand? This can explain why some of us have a better first half than second half – muscle fatigue.

Finally, all feeling a little self-conscious, we each had our delivery style assessed. It was amazing to see the difference a small tweak to our approach could make. We had a variety of corrections to make: making sure you shifted your weight correctly; spacing your feet for optimum balance as you step forward; ensuring your head was lined up with your line of delivery; bracing your opposite leg correctly; not sinking down too low when the green was slow.

The coaches created a very relaxed, fun atmosphere and enthusiastically shared lots of helpful anecdotes. We have gone away with personalised advice as well as some very useful exercises to hone our skills further. No matter how long you have been bowling, sign up for the next session! Thank you Sue Mayhew for the write-up of the coaching event.
